<u>Reading</u>

(planned from the National Curriculum 2014)

- Through regular English workshops and group reading activities, we will explore a range of narrative texts and use these to ask questions about vocabulary, discuss inference and develop prediction skills.
- English workshops will also be an opportunity to browse context books, listen to audiobooks, group read, revisit grammar and practise comprehension skills.
- We will continue our daily class reads, with a focus on inference, vocabulary and predictions.
- Developing ability to use grammar, focusing on the use of verbs, adjectives, tenses, sentence structure, speech, punctuation, and different ways of presenting text.
- The purposes and uses of commas, apostrophes, inverted commas and paragraphs.

<u>English</u>

<u>Writing</u>

(planned from the National Curriculum 2014)

- All writing opportunities are designed around stimuli, including fiction/ non fiction books and videos to cover a wide genre of writing. We aim to make writing as cross curricular as possible.
- Writing process: weekly grammar introduced at the beginning of the week, leading into planning of writing, oral rehearsal opportunities and finally writing and editing.
- Regular writing focusing on: setting descriptions, dialogue, writing in role, note making and non-chronological reports. The children will be taught the appropriate layout for each style of writing.
- Weekly differentiated spellings ~ raising awareness of and practising spelling rules ~ to be reinforced at home each week.
- Planning, proof reading, self editing and occasionally publishing
- Developing ability to use grammar, focusing on the use of verbs, adjectives, tenses, sentence structure, speech, adverbs, and different ways of presenting text.
- Regular handwriting practice.





Speaking & Listening

- We will be continuing to build on key skills relating to Speaking and Listening from our Autumn term.
- Children will be given opportunities to engage in class discussions and participate in paired and group conversations relating to the context.
- They will also build on their listening skills and they will be encouraged to take turns sharing ideas relating to all areas of the curriculum.
- Regular class discussions using Picture News to share opinions and learn how to debate.
- Performance poetry




Mathematics

(planned from the National Curriculum 2014)

- We are continuing to focus on developing mental strategies through regular mixed maths sessions.
- The children regularly practise the written methods learned
- We also focus on developing strategies to be able to check answers using different approaches, including using the inverse or estimating.
- Continuing to develop skills in working systematically and logically. They are taught to articulate their thought processes in all maths sessions and to develop their reasoning skills.
- Statistics, time, money, division, multiplication and capacity.









<u>Life and Living Things – 'Minibeasts'</u>


- Classifying vertebrates and invertebrates
- Investigating the habitats of pond and woodland creatures
- Using keys to identify minibeasts
- Exploring food chains and feeding relationships
- Discover how minibeasts have adapted to suit the environments in which they live.

Computing

- Continuing to discuss internet safety and safe searches
- Using the internet to research and investigate the environment and minibeasts
- Manipulating images and text to create a fictional minibeasts annotated with adaptations.
- Using Digimaps and Google maps to find and locate the school and local area and identify changes over time







<u>History</u>

 Investigating and discussing how the school and local area has changed over time, using plans, maps and first hand accounts.

<u>Geography</u>

- We will be exploring the local area using a map to independently navigate the route.
- Collecting information about local services, land use and traffic.
- We will be using key map skills.
- We will be considering the role of humans in improving or spoiling the environment through considering environmental issues such as recycling and pollution.



Art and Design

- We will be continuing to develop key skills in sketching, collage, painting, model making (sculpture) and designing.
- Through a range of projects, children will be planning, designing and evaluating their work and the work of others.

<u>Music</u>

- <u>Composing and Performing</u>
- Developing skills in composing and performing to the class and year group (Weather Medley)
- Recording compositions.

<u> P.E.</u>

<u>Gymnastics</u>

- developing control, co-ordination and skill through the themes of travelling, balancing and turning.
- Using equipment to explore rhythmic gymnastics, performing sequences to music.

 Athletics, including sprinting, hurdling, and throwing and jumping techniques, disc sports and tennis.
